## REPORT ON THE CAPACITY BUILDING INDUCTION WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH ADMINISTRATION AND ADVANCEMENT

#### INTRODUCTION

This report seeks to avail you with the highlights on recent capacity building workshops aimed at enriching the scope of research administration and advancement within the university in which the Faculties were represented as critical stakeholders.

The workshops (5 in Number so far) are the following:

- Public Relations as it relates to Research Administration, Advancement, Linkages and Partnerships- Dr.

## I. Public Relations as it relates to Research Administration, Advancement, Linkages and Partnerships

The opening keynote address was delivered by the Deputy Registrar (DRAA), Mr. Oladipo Ajayi, who welcomed the Director, Prof. Christine Ofulue, the resource person, Dr. Andee Iheme, and all participants to the workshop.

In her opening remarks, the Director gave an overview of the Directorate listing the aim, vision, mission, focus, functions and units under the Directorate.

#### MainThrust of the Presentation

In the presentation taken by Dr. Andee Iheme, former Centre Director, Calabar Study Centre and a renowned Public Relations (PR) Expert listed the goals of Research Administration and Advancement as; enhancing funding for research, training and service activities and to assist in the management of awards. He added that strategic communication is effective in addressing the challenges inherent in persuading donors to part with their endowments for research and development purposes. He opined that a good strategic communicator begins by first defining his objective, identifying the target audience, determining the behavior (action) required, determining how the



- communication process will be monitored and evaluated. He listed attributes of quality information to include; being true, in consonance with kiss, accurate, legally sound, timely, have right tone and being complete.
- Dr. Iheme added that Advancement work thrives where an organization's track record is founded on honesty, integrity, and truth. He highlighted what the prospective donor/sponsor expects to benefit from the relationship such as; tax relief, reputation enhancement, sales benefit, political benefits, social prestige and corporate favours. The public relation practitioner in pursuing advancement projects may include combination of publications, facility visits, lobbying, fairs etc. Moreover, various communication channels such as social media, mass media, advocacy activities, billboards and corporate gifts could be used to achieve this purpose.
- The Resource Person laid emphasis on writing and or content of good proposals which he alludes must be need driven and must be of problem solving type. He suggested that proposals should emphasize more of 'substance' rather than 'form', stating that what sells a proposal may not necessarily be the message but the messenger. A position of promise and potential sells a proposal faster and better than one of hopelessness and beggarly despair.



#### 2. Institutional Linkages and Partnerships

In his presentation, Prof. Rotimi Ogidan, Executive Director, African Centre for Distance Education (ACDE), explained *International Linkage* to mean the relationships and interactions which exist between institutions or organizations to promote flow of information, ideas and integration to achieve shared objectives. It can also be described as a process that establishes purposeful and profiled relationship between institutions, organizations or individuals across nationalities or countries. He said most of the time; it could be for educational, social, religious, cultural or other purposes. It could also be a relationship between



the strong and the weak or between bodies that are at par. Examples of international linkage is what exists between NOUN and SOU, OUS and NOUN, ACDE and CoL, NOUN and OUK, NOUN and OUS, etc

- He listed the benefits as; provides accurate and rich knowledge about people, places, issues, needs and concerns, Linkages build capacity of partners which also result in empowerment. It is a reliable strategy of exchanging resources, promotes common understanding of issues, promotes respect for the partners who are involved in the relationship, and increases the national and international rating of an Organization/University.
- It helps to build global footprint in teaching, research collaboration and world development. It connects people who want to learn new things and develop new ideas to improve the world around them, challenges man to see problems through the eyes of others as common concerns. Linkages can also result into funding, exchange of state of the art/modern facilities, supports the actualization of the vision of the institutions, and addresses key challenges in an institution. Opens up an institution for the world to know the quality of what is on offer.
- He further explained the legal issues of international linkage such as documentation which is a procedure for keeping a record of the relationship/partnership, terms of agreement etc. He pointed out that the content of MOU should include, details of areas of agreement, mutual benefits, duration/ termination, confidentiality, settlement of disputes, signature should be appended by the Chief Executive Officers of the organizations or appointed staff on behalf of the CEO of the organization.
- He listed challenges in international linkages as; changing institutional leadership with attendant areas of priorities and interests, constantly changing technology, changing national political interests, differences in the pace of implementation of the terms of agreement in the MOU, sudden termination of the MOU. He concluded by saying that any institution that has the aspiration to attain world class standards should work hard to secure linkages with other high ranking institutions/organizations with similar vision in the world.

#### 3. Finding your Path in Research Administration

- Prof. Oyeronke A. Odunola, Director, Research Management Office, University of Ibadan, in her presentation tagged 'Finding your Path in Research Administration' talked about sponsored programs, projects and activities that are conducted by Faculty members and are supported by external funds awarded to the university.
- She listed roles of a Research Administrator as facilitating the link between research
  activities and research outcomes, to increase the effectiveness and productivity of
  institutional research by promoting the use of best practices in research
  administration; identify Faculty expertise and institutional research facilities.



- Prepare/maintain profiles of Faculty research interests, prepare/maintain/update descriptions of labs and core research facilities, disseminate funding opportunities, determine the best method for the institution, and enable Faculty to focus on relevant opportunities. She itemized qualities of a good Research Administrator as: welcoming and friendly, knowledgeable, presentable, good communication skill, confidentiality, punctuality, flexibility, understanding, good listener, and non-judgmental,
- She stressed that Faculty is expected to go through Research Administration for research, service,

instruction, training to identify ideas, document needs, find sponsors and determine funding priorities, contact sponsors, write proposals, draw budget, review research, proposal submission and awards. She concluded by saying that the entire organization will be more efficient and productive by these, and would make academics likely more content on the job and feel more valuable.

- In his presentation, Funding Research Opportunities, Mr. Olumiyiwa M. Desmennu, a staff in the Research Management Office, U.I. who complemented his Director's presentation, highlighted various possible sources of funding for research projects such as proposals/grants applications and fellowships, fundraising events like dinner and raffles, personal/instructional savings (fees, rent, consultancy and others). He stated types of donor funding available as; corporate donors, families and foundations, individual's donors, International non-governmental organizations (INGOs), faith based agencies, multi-nationals/UN agencies, government agencies, multilateral development banks.
- He listed various types of donors stressing that there are so many reasons why a donor may not give out
  funds even if one has the best proposal. Components in the request for proposals (RFA) are not a list of
  suggestions, but action plans and a review of the RFAs, and follow up. There are places to focus for funding
  opportunities such as funding database, donor websites, search engines, newsletters, newspapers, word of
  mouth, past grantees, senior staff and mentors. He concluded by providing various sites to check for
  grants.

## 4. Public Relations and Research Administration, Advancement, Linkages & Partnership Operations

• Dr. Mande Samaila, Ag. Dean of the School of Postgraduate Studies and the resource person, started by defining Public relations as goodwill, positive image and mutual understanding between an organisation and its publics. It is about healthy communication with a view to winning the affection of members of the public and Research as active engagement with the relevant domain of the world around us, leadership in thinking and doing, continual learning from, communication with, and dissemination to others.



- He highlighted the role of Public Relations in organisations as:
  - Planning and execution of all Public Relations related campaigns and programmes
  - Arranging press conferences, event coverage, open days, press monitoring, public relations and facility visits for the media
  - Clears all materials meant for publications, news stories and information that concerns a particular department with the departmental head before sending or releasing to the press.
- He emphasized what he called the bedrocks of effective persuasion as credibility, reasoning, motivation, refutation, effective communication environment, and interest.
- He affirmed that in order for universities to secure access to economic resources for research, increasingly strict demands will be placed on the benefit of this research for commercial or other societal development in the short and long term.
- The universities need to develop the capability of using the research knowledge for new products or services.
- He listed the challenges in enhancing the utilisation of research results as:
  - The universities must continue to develop enduring networks and relationship that are based on mutual trust between the parties
  - Leaders within academia must highlight the importance of collaboration with industry and society
  - Documentation of measurable deliverables as a part of the academic qualification systems
  - A specific challenge in supporting innovation activities will be to identify forms for the commercialisation of research innovations if the researchers themselves do not want to bring the idea on to commercial level
  - Supporting systems must be developed for resource-efficient utilisation of results, so that



researchers can continue to focus on their research activities.

He concluded by listing factors that lead to success as business case, trust and integrity, general
partnership principles, research collaboration / IP principles, realistic expectations, support from senior
leadership, partnership champions, strong interpersonal relationships, good governance practices and
good management practices.

#### 5. Staying in the Fog or Getting into the Loop? - Professor Ibikunle H.Tijani

In his presentation, Prof. Ibikunle Tijani, Centre Director, NURTW Special Study Centre, Garki, Abuja, contextualized the DRAA as the cockpit of the institution, the powerhouse for global and national ranking, anchor of research activities, and an advisory body in line with the NOUN Act and Senate Committee system. It also drives University wide research agenda and Journal Publications, serves as a clearing house for Faculty/Department based journals, and coordinates implementation of research aspects of MOUs, builds the Database for research and webometric ranking. It should be able to provide visibility on Researchgate and other avenues to showcase research output, and promote NOUN's academic integrity.



He listed the various areas DRAA can provide support for academics and other stakeholders as Grants, Advancement, and Development in the under listed areas:

- Alumni and advancement
- Industrial linkages
- Seek and implement grants
- Endowment campaigns
- Seeding Labs
- Carnegie African Diaspora
- Association of Commonwealth Scholarships/Fellowships
- US Fulbright Scholarships/Fellowships and other opportunities, International Council for Open and Distance Learning Education
- MOU follow up, and would require support of the Legal Unit.





Fig 1.0 Student Population

## **Graduate Population**








Fig 1.1 Graduate Population by Faculty








Fig 1.2 Academic Staff Population by Faculty




Fig 1.4 Summary of Research output




Fig 1.5 Graphical Presentation of Research output

#### Project objectives (Max 200 words)

The project was a research titled "An Expository Study of Quality Assurance

<u>Practices in the Single and Dual Mode Distance Learning Institutions in Nigeria</u>". The objectives of the research project are to identify the areas of operations of the institutions that are quality assured; analyse the standard of quality assurance adopted by the institutions; evaluate the appropriateness of the quality assurance indicators being implemented and also identify the challenges militating against the quality assurance that is put in place by the institutions.

#### Summary of the outcome (Max 200 words)

The outcome of the research revealed that both the single mode and dual mode open and distance learning institutions in Nigeria quality assured their operations and programmes using adopted strategies of the two different modes although there is the inkling that the strategies adopted by the single mode institutions are better than that of the dual mode institution when compared with current best practices. The research also showed that there are challenges faced by the single and dual modes institutions in Nigeria in terms of quality assurances of their operations and programmes. Although the need for quality assuring of operations and services between dual and the single modes ODL institutions in Nigeria does not quite significantly differ, the single mode institution showed more concern for the need to always quality assure their operations and programmes than the dual mode institutions. It is also discovered that the single-mode systems benefited from an institutional commitment to distance and open learning mode and the urge to achieving professional standards and quality in spite of the need for expensive infrastructure that supports a cost-effective model of education through high enrolment volumes that will result in observably significant economies of scale. Dual mode institutions, in contrast, were characterized as potentially offering courses on campus and by distance education that met the same quality standards. The study also revealed that dual mode distance learning institutions is faced with formidable impediments such as disinterested faculty members and a form of teaching that was less valued and less effective than what they offer on the campus based arm of the institutions.

#### Project objectives (Max 200 words)

The project was a research titled "Evaluation of the Contributions of Open and Distance Learning Education Institutions in Nigeria. The objectives of the research project was to identify the degree of access to education and training created by the distance learning institutions. It aimed at evaluate the availability and appropriateness of the technological infrastructures being adopted by the distance learning institutions and also determine the readiness of the distance learning institutions to provide open and distance learning mode of education as the alternative means of providing education to the citizenry.

#### Summary of the outcome (Max 200 words)

The outcome of the research project revealed that Open and distance learning (ODL) is significant in Nigeria as an alternative way to meet the huge unmet demand for education especially at higher education level. It showed that the available ODL institutions; both of single and of dual institutions extraction are creating access to education inspite of harsh terrain of operations and recognised the impact which the use of ICT have on access creation and are working towards making sure that the required technologies are put in place for smooth running of their operations as also observed by Galusha (1997) and Carr (2000) that the use of educational technologies in distance education has the potential in addressing most of the challenges that distance learners encounter in their learning which sometimes are so pressing to the extent that some distance learners opt to withdraw from studies and others delay to graduate. It confirmed that ODL institutions know the challenges that are militating against the creation of access to education through their system hence the need for them to work round the clock as they currently do to see that their identified and anticipated challenges and problems are alleviated in order to show their readiness to offer education to the masses and also their relevance in the educational development of Nigeria.

#### **Project objectives (Max 200 words)**

The project was a research titled "Bridging the Gender Gap: Measures to Improve Women Participation in Higher Education Management in Nigeria". The objectives of the research project was to determine the reasons why there is such a huge gap between senior male and female staff that performs the administrative roles in the higher education management in Nigeria. The research set out to identify the degree of access to education and training created for senior female administrative and management staff of higher institutions by the distance learning institutions and also focused on providing appropriate suggestion that will help reduce the observable gap in the number of male and female gender handling senior administrative roles in the management of higher institutions in Nigeria

#### Summary of the outcome (Max 200 words)

The outcome of the research project revealed the reasons why there is such a huge gap between senior male staff and senior female staff that handle the administrative roles in the higher education management in Nigeria. Just like every other country of the world, except a few, it is the level of knowledge of the job; that is, the technical know-



how, discipline, gender inequality and gender roles which take female staff away from their respective duties as soon as it is closing time are major reasons for the observable gap. The study also showed that the ODL mode of education allowed most of the female staff to attend trainings and workshops in various areas of capacity buildings while still remaining on the job. They do not need to resign from their jobs before attending such trainings and workshops since the mode of education encourage and preaches work-and-learn.

"A critical appraisal of the mode of curriculum implementation of Nigerian secondary school curriculum: Towards socio-economic empowerment of youth"

#### **Project Objectives (Max 200 words)**

The Nigerian secondary education system was designed to empower the youth for self-employment yet, the majority of Nigerian youth are idle and lack the requisite skills needed for job creation. The broad aim of the study was to assess how the curriculum was being implemented in Nigerian secondary schools with a view to identifying the root cause of the problem. The specific objectives were to:

- determine the appropriateness of the Nigeria secondary education curriculum;
- find out the type of teaching method used in implementing the curriculum;
- determine the number of skill-based subjects taught in Nigerian secondary schools;
- assess the availability of infrastructural facilities;
- assess the availability of specialist teachers;
- identify practical (entrepreneurial) skills students have learnt in school with which they can create selfemployment;
- identify the students' entrepreneurial capability i.e. products and services they have produced/marketed;

The subjects comprised 380 secondary school students and 120 teachers drawn from four categories of school: federal government-owned school (FGS), state government-owned school (SGS), high class private school (HCPS), and low class private school (LCPS). The study utilized both quantitative and qualitative techniques with practical test, observation, survey questionnaires and focus group discussion as instruments used in data collection.

#### Summary of the Outcome (Max 200 words)

The findings of the study revealed that the Nigerian secondary school curriculum was fairly but not effectively implemented. The following factors appeared to be the root cause of the problem: theory-based teaching method, insufficient specialist teachers, lack of infrastructural facilities and workshops for practical work, and lack of entrepreneurial knowledge. Home Economics, Agricultural Science, Introductory Technology, Music, Fine Art, Food and Nutrition, Technical Drawing, Computer Science and Typing/Shorthand were the core vocational and technical subjects that were mostly taught while Art & Craft, Clothing & Textiles, Metal Work, Building Construction, Woodwork, Applied Electricity, Electronics and Auto Mechanic did not receive much attention due to lack of specialist teachers. The students have learnt significant self-employable entrepreneurial skills in the following areas: Fine Art [Drawing], Home Economics [Sewing], Agricultural Science [Farming], Food & Nutrition [Cookery], Introductory Technology [Electrical Works] and Music [singing]; however their entrepreneurial capability was significantly low as there were no significant production of marketable goods and services to show for their practical knowledge. Among the recommendations made is the need for Federal Government to provide infrastructural facilities in all secondary schools across the nation with adequate provision of equipments, Instructional materials, and tools to make the teaching and learning of the skill-based subjects meaningful. This way, students will have the opportunity to engage in practical works. This will enable them to be motivated in identifying entrepreneurial opportunities.

"An assessment of competency-based learning elements in study materials developed by the National Open University of Nigeria"

#### Objectives (Max 200 words)

The success and sustainability of many ODL initiatives have often been ascribed to the quality of their learning materials. In the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), majority of the students work and learn. Consequently, their concern is to acquire skills and competencies from their studies which they can subsequently apply in their places of work and businesses. The broad aim of the study was to evaluate the extent to which competency-based learning elements is embedded in the design and development of course materials used by NOUN students and to assess whether or not the students posses the requisite skills and competencies as prescribed in their course programmes. The specific objectives were to:

- examine the existing NOUN course materials with a view to assessing the level of competency based learning elements embedded therein,
- determine how well students had attained mastery of the competencies prescribed in their course programme,
- find out the proportion of students who had difficulties acquiring competencies prescribed in their course programmes,
- determine possible influence of some variables (age, gender, employment status, marital status, frequency of tutorial attendance, and programme of study) on the competency level of NOUN students,

283 students, 43 copies of course materials, and 43 subject specialists formed the sample for the study. Data collection instruments included competency-based learning checklist, competency-based practical skills test, students' performance assessment measure, and course material analysis format.

#### Summary of the Outcome (Max 200 words)

A significant proportion of sampled course materials had adequate number of learning objectives that were stated in measurable behavioural terms (knowledge level), while a majority of the course materials were found deficient in performance-based objectives (practical skills). The overall components of the course modules were highly rated with exception of two components (statement of performance objectives and evaluation devises) which received poor rating. NOUN students generally achieved low mastery of competencies in the performance of their tasks. However, students demonstrated highest competencies in accuracy and logical reasoning followed by clarity, application and sequence of ideas in that order. The least attained competency was in self-learning followed by coverage and problem solving ability. Eighty-four (29.7%) of sampled students appeared to have difficulties in acquiring competencies prescribed in their course programmes as opposed to 199 (70.3%) who appeared to have mastered the competencies. Student's gender, attendance at tutorial classes and geopolitical zones had significant relative contributions in their competency level, while age, employment status, marital status and School had no relative contributions to students' competency level. Female students achieved higher competency scores than male students. In light of these findings, some recommendations were made towards improving the quality of NOUN course materials to reflect competency-based learning which would in turn translate to practical learning efficiency on the part of students.

"Employers' perception and expectations of professional competency of distance learning graduate: A tracer study of graduates of National Open University of Nigeria"

#### **Project Objectives (Max 200 words)**

Noting the skepticism against open and distance learning (ODL) and the challenge of acceptability of ODL certificates by labour market, the need to assess the quality of ODL graduates in workplace becomes imperative. The study was designed to track NOUN graduates in their places of work with a view to ascertaining their level of professional competency and to explore employers' expectation of graduate competencies. Since research has found that competencies are acquired at different rates in different professions, it is essential to focus on one particular field at a time when conducting a tracer study. Hence, the study targeted graduates from the B.Sc Nursing Programme, given the nature of the programme which is competency-based. Specifically, the study was designed to determine:

- the present level of professional competency among NOUN graduate nurses in their workplace as assessed by external assessors;
- whether there have been any significant change in NOUN graduates' attitude to work (from the time of enrollment to the time of completion of studies and thereafter);
- the proportion of professional competency that is attributed to workplace experience and the proportion attributed to the education received from NOUN;
- the proportion of NOUN graduates that met employer expectations;
- perception of NOUN graduates on the quality of education provision in NOUN;

This study employed a mixed methodology using a purposively selected sample of 240 NOUN alumni who graduated in Nursing programme, and a corresponding 240 heads/top-level managers of the organizations where the graduate nurses were employed. Multiple instruments were used to collect data including competency tests, survey questionnaire, direct observation and interview schedules.

#### Summary of the Outcome (Max 200 words)

Majority of sampled graduates appeared to possess high level of professional competency in all three competency dimensions measured (clinical performance, nursing documentation, and knowledge and understanding of nursing practice). A significant proportion of employers seemed to hold high perception regarding the graduates. NOUN graduates demonstrated a positive attitude to work both before and after graduation. The rating of the employers showed significant changes in graduates' attitude to work as reflected in the reduced rate of absenteeism, lateness, number of complaints, number of queries and warnings, number of work-related accidents, and use of mobile phone. The findings based on graduates' assessment of themselves corroborated those of the employers. A significant proportion of graduates met and exceeded employer expectations. A high proportion 108 (62.4%) of NOUN graduate nurses appeared to have acquired competencies that could be attributed to workplace experience while 65 (37.6%) had competencies that could be attributed to the education received from NOUN. Also, the quality of education provision in NOUN with respect to B.Sc Nursing programme was highly rated by the majority of sampled NOUN graduate nurses. The quality of course content topped the list of ten indicators that received highest rating while provision of clinical practicum exercise and the quality of infrastructural facilities were rated the least.

• There is need for NOUN to conduct more tracer studies in other areas of professional fields and their findings utilized in the decision-making process of the institution. It would therefore be desirable to set up a tracer study unit in NOUN that would coordinate such tracer studies.

"Metacognitive awareness and self-regulation learning strategies among students in self-directed learning situations: An exploratory study"

#### **Project Objectives (Max 200 words)**

Considering the peculiar nature of distance learners, success in distance learning is said to depend largely on learners' deployment of metacognitive and self-regulatory processes. Although NOUN has put in place various support programmes designed to help students navigate through learning and progress in their studies, assessment records indicate that some students perform below expectation particularly on pen-on-paper semester examinations. Therefore, the quest for a solution to improve NOUN students' learning efficiency prompted the need for the study. The main aim of the study was to explore the extent to which NOUN students possess metacognitive awareness processes and how well they regulate those processes in learning. The specific objectives were to:

- ascertain the level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulatory strategies attained by NOUN students;
- examine the extent to which NOUN students use meta-cognitive awareness and self-regulation strategies in learning and study of course modules;
- compare the high and low achievers on their level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulated strategies;
- determine the relationship between metacognition, self-regulation, and academic achievement of NOUN students;
- determine whether students' level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulated strategies tend to differ according to gender, age, year of study, and study location.

Participants included 600 students drawn from various undergraduate programmes from 12 Study Centres. Data collection tools included survey questionnaires, focus group discussion, and academic achievement measure.

#### Summary of the Outcome (Max 200 words)

A significant number of NOUN students appeared to possess high level of metacognitive awareness as well as high level of self-regulatory strategies. A majority of NOUN students seem to use metacognitive awareness skills and self-regulatory strategies in the learning process to a large extent. No significant difference was found between the high and low achievers in their level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulation strategies. There was no significant relationship between metacognitive awareness and self-regulation on academic achievement of NOUN students. Metacognitive awareness and self-regulation explained only 0.3% of the variance in academic achievement of NOUN students. The variables of age was not a factor influencing the level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulation among NOUN students. The findings of this study showed that NOUN students appeared to possess high level of metacognitive awareness and self-regulated learning strategies. The results of this study are promising even though it did not unravel what we set out to achieve. It could be deduced from the findings of the study that these are not the factors contributing to poor academic achievement among NOUN students. Therefore, other potential factors not identified in this study should form the focus of future research.

"Child discipline and violence in Nigeria: A community-based intervention programme to reduce violent discipline and other forms of negative parenting practices"

#### **Project Objectives (Max 200 words)**

Given the growing research that demonstrate that the use of corporal punishment with children is harmful, and considering that many Nigerian parents utilize such methods to discipline children without realizing the implications, we developed and implemented a programme of intervention called parenting education programme (PEP) as a tool to help parents develop appropriate child behaviour management techniques. The primary aim of the study was to evaluate the effectiveness of PEP programme by achieving the following objectives:

- 1. Assess the effect of PEP intervention programme in bringing about a change in:
  - i. Parental beliefs about the perceived disciplinary value of corporal punishment.
  - ii. Parental attitude toward corporal punishment of children.
  - iii. The frequency of parental use of corporal punishment in child rearing.
- 2. Assess the durability of treatment effect over time on each outcome variable (I,ii,&iii)
- 3. Determine the influence of parental demographic variables (gender, marital status, educational level, and ethnic background) on the treatment effect with regards to each of the outcome variables (I,ii, & iii)
- 4. Assess the extent to which the PEP programme can impact parental ability to employ non-violent techniques in child rearing
- 5. Assess parental acceptability and satisfaction with the PEP programme

The study was executed using a quasi-experimental design, using 300 parents of young children aged 3-12 years, recruited through a multi-stage sampling process. Multiple measures were used for data collection including a screening measure, questionnaire, home observation checklist, PEP delivery observation guide, and a programme satisfaction survey.

#### Summary of the Outcome (Max 200 words)

Intervention parents, when compared to the control group parents, reported significantly reduced belief in the perceived value of corporal punishment and demonstrated a lower level of attitudinal disposition towards its use. Significant reductions were observed in the frequency with which parents used corporal punishment (beating, slapping, abusing, threats and name calling) on their children. Also, significant improvements were observed in parenting behaviour as many parents were seen using more positive discipline methods on their children including verbal praise and redirecting; a feat that was lacking prior to intervention. Effect sizes associated with the gains in parental outcomes were in the medium to large range (0.62- 0.84). The ANCOVA analyses of the observed data revealed significant treatment effects on all parental outcomes examined with effect sizes (partial eta square  $n^2$ ) ranging from .050 to .086, which were considered to be in the medium to large range. At 12 weeks follow-up, treatment effect was stable with regards to each of the parental outcomes. The findings of the study provided empirical support for implementation of the PEP programme on a wider scale. The provision of such a support programme is essential to promote the development of parenting competences so that parents have the knowledge and skills needed to raise their children well, without using violence and thus, become more effective in their parenting in ways that support their children's optimal development.

Some of the vegetables currently under trial are: Diva cucumber, Yellow pepper, Bitter gold, Berry tomatoes. Cherry tomatoes (Solanum lycopersicum) are relatively easy to grow. This variety can be stored (30 days) well under room temperature. It is known to be of benefit in weight management. It is a major dietary source of lycopene and beta carotene which are antioxidants important in preventing heart disease and cancer

Bella cucumba (Cucumis sativus) is very soft, sweet and seedless. The variety starts fruiting from 30-40 days after planting. It contains about 4% potassium, 3% fibre and 4% vitamin C daily human requirements. It is resistant to powdery mildew

Scientifically known as *Capsicum annuum*, this variety is very hot and sweeter than the local variety. It can be stored at room temperature for 2-3 weeks without spoilage. The concentration of vitamin c surpasses that of citrus fruits.

Bitter gourd (*Momordica charantia*) also known as bitter melon or bitter stash is known to boost immunity, cures liver and diabetes problems and prevents constipation. The fruit is dark or light green depending on the region where it is grown




Fig 4.6: Journal of Physical and Life Sciences
